Buckingham Palace

- the official residence and office of the British Queen Elizabeth II.
- Queen Victoria was the first monarch who lived in Buckingham Palace, moved into the newly completed palace in 1837
- Every year about 50,000 invited guests come to garden parties, receptions, audiences and banquets

The London Eye (Millennium Wheel)

- giant Ferris wheel: 135 m tall, 120 m diameter, tallest in Europe, cost £70 million
- major components - the steel from the UK, fabricated in the Netherlands, the cables from Italy, the bearings from Germany, the spindle and hub from the Czech Republic, the capsules from France (the glass from Italy), and the electrical components from the UK.



Piccadilly Circus

- Road junction, known for a video display and neon signs mounted on the corner building
- statue of an archer popularly known as *Eros* (Anteros)

St Paul's Cathedral

- seat of the Bishop of London
- 17th century – Sir Christopher Wren
- funerals of Lord Nelson, the Duke of Wellington and Sir Winston Churchill
- marriage of Charles, Prince of Wales, and Lady Diana Spencer

Tower Bridge

- The symbol of London
- consists of two towers tied together at the upper level by two walkways



Trafalgar Square

- Nelson's Column (Admiral H. Nelson died in the battle)
- named after the Battle of Trafalgar (1805), a British naval victory of the Napoleonic Wars over France
- Many statues, sculptures

British Museum, National Gallery

- one of the world's greatest museums of human history and culture
- Art museum – on Trafalgar Square



The London Underground (the Tube)

- the oldest underground railway network in the world (opened in 1863)
- the second-most extensive - 11 lines (after the Shanghai Metro)

Parks and Gardens

- The largest parks – Hyde Park (sports, open-air concerts, Speakers' Corner), Kensington Gardens and Regent's Park (London Zoo, the world's oldest scientific zoo)
- St. James's Park – the oldest of the Royal Parks of London

- London has been a major settlement for two millennia,

- London Heathrow is the world's busiest airport by number of international passengers
- the first city to host the modern Summer Olympic Games three times (in 2012)
- temperate oceanic climate
