Who is it?

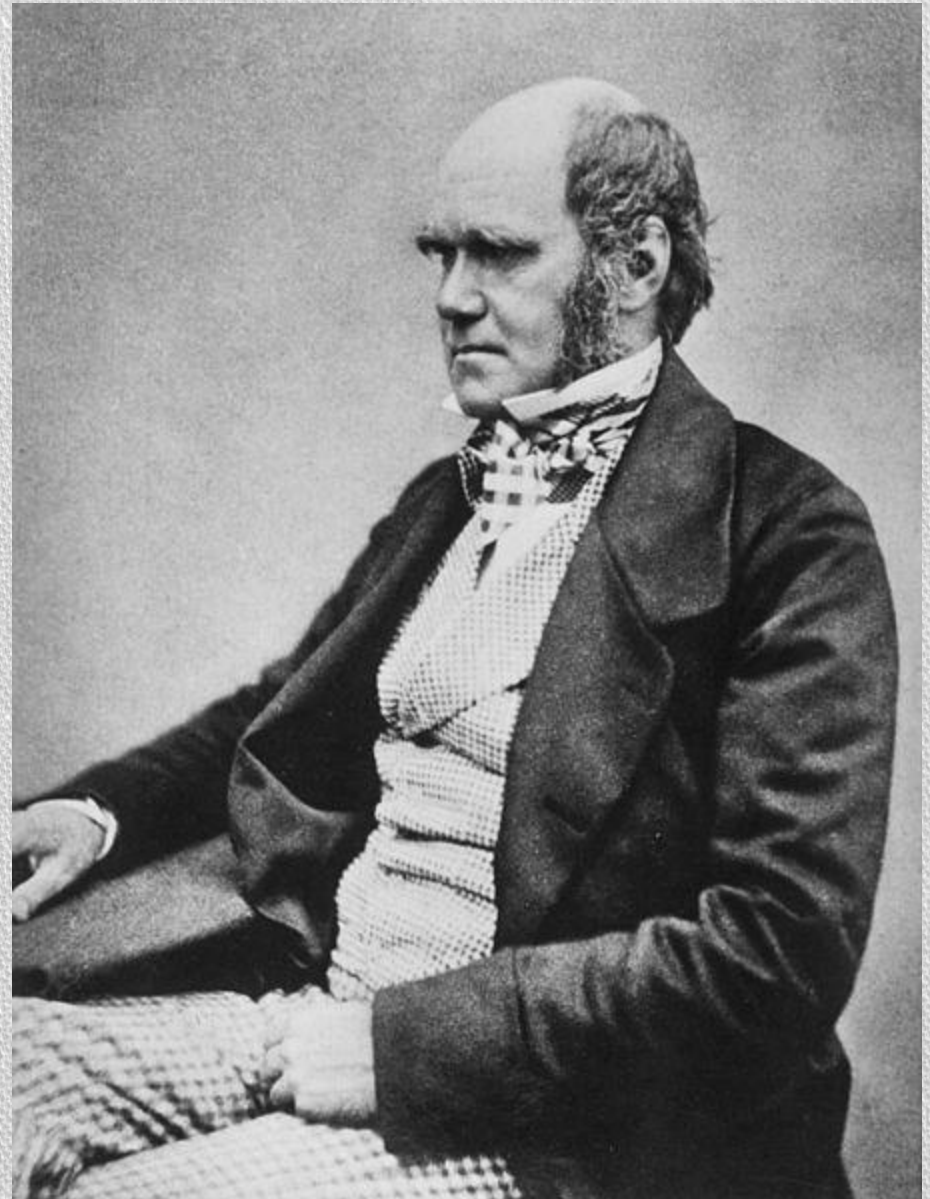
- 30 November 1874 – 24 January 1965
- a British politician
- led the UK during the Second World War
- Prime Minister – twice
- received the Nobel Prize in Literature
- from an aristocratic family
- named the Greatest Briton of all time in 2002

Winston Churchill



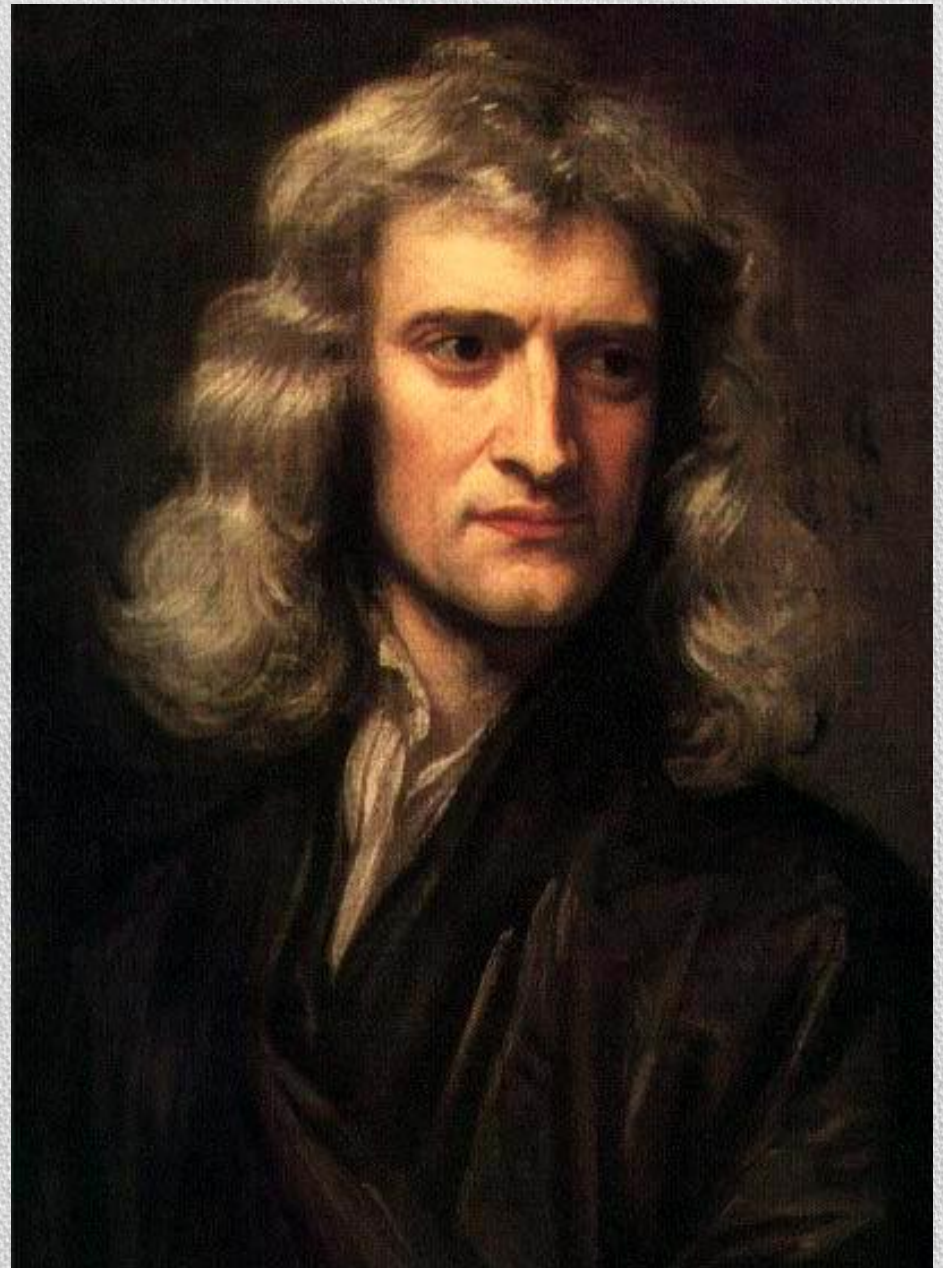
- 12 February 1809 – 19 April 1882
- an English naturalist, scientist
- published theory of evolution in his book ***On the Origin of Species***
- supported the idea of natural selection
- studied at the University of Cambridge
- married his cousin Emma Wedgwood

Charles Darwin



- 25 December 1642 – 20 March 1727
- physicist, mathematician, astronomer, natural philosopher, alchemist, theologian
- originator of the theory of gravitation (inspired after watching the fall of an apple from a tree)
- laws of classical mechanics
- three laws of motion
- ***Principia*** – one of the most influential works in the world of science

Isaac Newton



- 7 September 1533 – 24 March 1603
- popular monarch in England
- period of internal stability
- from Tudor dynasty
- defeated Spanish Armada
- her mother was executed when she was two and a half years old
- established English Protestant church
- The Virgin Queen
- During her reign – increasing popularity of English drama (William Shakespeare, Christopher Marlowe), seafaring (Sir Francis Drake)

Elizabeth I Of England



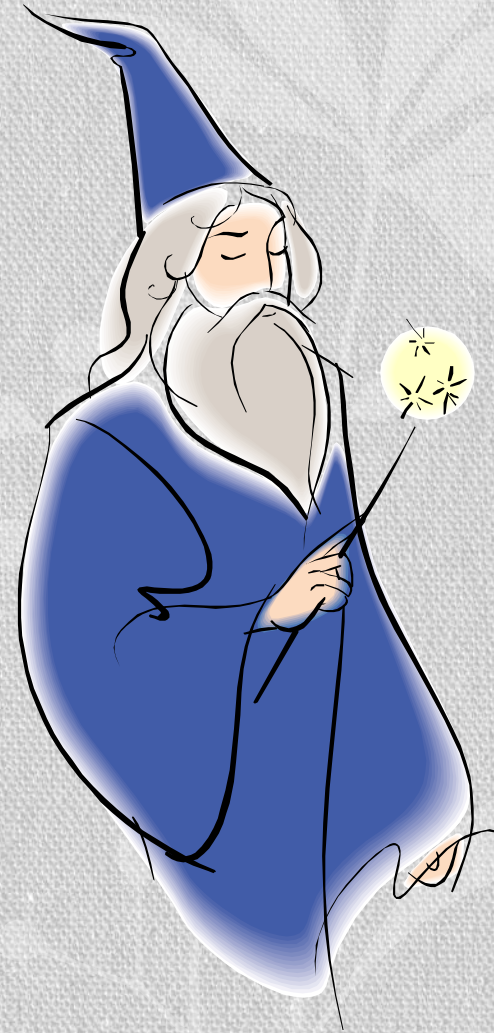
- 5 September 1946 – 24 November 1991
- original name – Farrokh Bulsara
- born in Zanzibar
- a British musician, singer and songwriter
- Britain's first Asian rock star
- lead vocalist and lyricist of the famous rock band
- vocals over a four-octave range
- bisexual
- died of bronchopneumonia brought on by AIDS (diagnosed in 1987)
- Bohemian Rhapsody, We are the Champions, ...

Freddie Mercury



- born 31 July 1965 in Yate, Gloucestershire, England
- a British novelist
- author of best-selling fantasy book series in the world
- the twelfth richest woman in the UK
- Studied French and Classics at the University of Exeter
- works for charity (president of one parent families organisation)
- took part at the 2012 Summer Olympics opening ceremony in London

J.K. Rowling



- born on 13 February 1974
- an English singer-songwriter, sometimes actor
- a member of the former pop group Take That
- problems with alcohol and cocaine
- very successful as solo singer
- 2004 – UK Music Hall of Fame
- 2006 - Guinness Book of World Records – sold 1.6 million tickets of his Close Encounters Tour in one day
- married to actress Ayda Field
- 17 BRIT awards
- Angels, Rock DJ, Eternity, Feel
